showcasing their talents as economists or bankers.

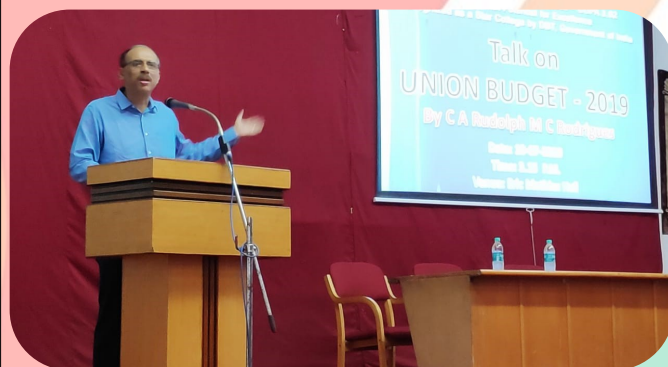

## One-day study tour to Dharmasthala

With the humble consent of the principal St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), the students of II M.Sc. Food Science, Nutrition and Dietetics of the college, went for a one-day study tour to Dharmasthala, - a pilgrimage centre in the district of Dakshina kannada on the 24<sup>th</sup> of July, 2019. Accompanying them, were three faculties from the Department, Ms Shilpa Lekha, Ms Daniella Chyne and Ms Jovita Carol. The purpose of this trip was to expose the students to the practical knowledge and intricacies of institutional diet preparation done in large diet kitchens and also the working of such public institutional kitchens.

The students along with their faculty reached Dharmasthala at 10 am. They were provided with refreshments and a short time period of 10 to 15mins to freshen up. The group first visited the Ugrana (food and commod-



ities storage house), where they store grains and grocery, vegetables and other miscellaneous commodities. This enabled our students to learn how each commodity is stored to last for a longer period till its utilisation. Some traditional storage methods were followed, e.g., storing rice tied in straw baskets, in order to prevent moisture entering and damaging the grains. Pumpkins were stored tied and hung from the ceiling so as to prevent contact of the vegetable with possible spoilage medium. This keeps the pumpkins fresh for 4 to 6 months. Similarly, many other storage methods of different food commodities were illustrated.

The next visit was to the 'Mill' where the milling machines for oil and rice were available. The authorities briefed the entire group on the working of each machine. They were also briefed about the maintenance of the stores and food balance sheets used in the Ugrana. The students, were then taken to the Goshale (cowshed), where they housed around 200 cows. They were shown how these cows are reared for their milk, and how milk products were produced. Products such as milk, curd, buttermilk and ghee are obtained and processed out of the milk obtained.

The main purpose of this trip was to visit the Annapurna kitchen (institute kitchen). Here, the authority member showed us the processing, cooking and distribution methods of food. Pre-processing of food such as destoning of rice and grains via a destoner machine was illustrated. Other pre-processing methods of foods, such as vegetable cutting and chopping and coconut scraping were done using large machines. The manual churners were also used. Cooking of foods such as Dal, Rasam, Vegetables was done in huge steam operated vessels having 60 lts capacity each. Rice in these vessels can be cooked as

fast as 10 mins per load.

The service of food from the kitchen to the dining hall is properly streamlined. About 250 people are solely responsible for food distribution and clearing up of the dining hall after every batch is done. The foods they serve the devotees are rice, rasam, sambar, buttermilk, sweet, ba-jji's. On Sundays and Mondays they serve more than 50,000 devotees and on other days around 10 - 15 thousand. On special occasions or feasts, it goes up to more than 1 lakh. The lunch is served from 1p.m. - 3p.m. and dinner from 7p.m. - 10p.m. at the Annapurna.

The students and faculty were also provided lunch. Thereafter, the group were privileged to meet the Dharmadikari Dr. Shri Veerendra Hegede, with whom they had a small discussion on the importance of nutrition and its application in institutional diets.

The group ended this study trip with a visit to the Manjusha Museum, the Car Museum and the Gomateshwara statue within the vicinity of the premises, after which we returned back to the college by 6:30pm. The entire trip had been a good learning experience for the students. They are able to understand how diet kitchens in big institute work and how food service management in public places are streamlined. This exposure is very much needed for them to correlate their theoretical learning of the same through practical application.

- Principal, Rev Dr Praveen Martis welcomed the gathering and briefed on the admission of students for UG courses during the academic year. He also mentioned that the discipline in the college has been improved. Mid-Day Meal scheme has been extended up to 400 students. The needy and the deserved have received fee concession and scholarship from the Management.
- The new appointments made during the year were announced by the Principal. Dr Denis Fernandes will be the new Director for Admin Block, and Dr Alwyn D'Sa will be the new Controller of Examination, a new post created during the year. Mr Ashok Prasad will be EC/CC coordinator for the year.
- Mr Naveen Mascarenhas read the minutes of the previous council meeting which was approved by the house
- The UGC has asked the college to submit an action plan on Research, publications and innovations before sanctioning Deemed to be University status. A meeting has been called and four groups have been created to compile the data from the respective departments. The Conveners are as follows: a) Humanities & Social Sciences- Dr Denis Fernandes, b) Languages-Dr Ratan Tilak Mohunta, c) Science- Dr Chandrashekhara Shetty, d) Commerce and Management- Dr Suresh Poojary
- The second Volume of Value Education book will be released soon . Thanks to Dr Rose Veera DSouza for her hardwork in bringing out the volume.
- The College Magazine is almost ready under Anup Denzil's editorship.
- CBCS programmes has been implemented for the first year BA, BSc, BCom, BBA and BCA students and the classes are held regularly for them.
- The COE has informed that internal exams of the even semester will be held as per the schedule. He also pointed out that Examination Reform Committee meeting will be scheduled after the first internals and the council members were requested to give suggestions before the meeting. He also requested the head of the departments to see that the marks are submitted within the due date.
- The campus minister Rev Fr Felix informed that Retreat Programme for the Catholic students(Spoorthy) and Soft skills Programmes for others (Pragathi) were conducted on July 2 and 3<sup>rd</sup>. It went on very well. For soft skill Programme Dr Narayana Moolya headed the Core Committee.
- In view of St Ignatius Loyola's feast on July 31, Loyola Week will be organized by the campus ministry
- Interreligious feasts will be celebrated as it was in the previous year.
- The College will organize *Aloysius Got Talent (AGT)*. It was felt that the students of St Aloysius are highly talented but their talents go unnoticed. This year Physics department under Dr Ishwar Bhat is organising a certificate course in Yoga. Staff and students can also apply for MOOC courses.
- Musical Evening will be organized as per the schedule. However, this year the programme is sponsored by an alumni and therefore a few competitions on music could be conducted.
- Ms Kavitha gave the placement report. 25 companies visited the college. 216 students were selected at undergraduate level. This year a Job Fair will be organized .

Fr Sunny Jacob SJ, Secretary of Jesuit Educational Association (JEA) South Asia, Member of International Commission for Jesuit Education, Rome (ICAJE), National Advisor of JAAI – INDIA was invited to speak on



Draft National Educational Policy 2019 (NEP – 2019) to all the teaching staff of the College on 10 July 2019.

Fr Sunny presented the structure of the new policy for education right from Preschool education to Higher education. He said that there will be only 3 types of institutions at the Higher education level based on student strength & quality. While explaining the new initiatives of the draft policy, he also cautioned us with the possible outcome during the implementation of this policy. There will be no affiliating Universities or affiliating Colleges & all Institution will become standalone, he said.

The policy recommends 4 years of integrated B.Ed for teachers. Rashtriya Shiksha Aayoga (RSA) will monitor & regulate education in the country & for HEI's there will be NHEAI, National Higher Education Authority of India, he said. At the end of his 45 minutes talk, he answered few of the questions from the staff. He invited the members to attend the detailed presentation, at MCC Bank Auditorium, the same day afternoon. He



requested the staff to go through the policy & be tuned to the new changes which are going to come. Fr Principal welcomed Fr Sunny with the bouquet of the flower & thanked Fr Sunny for the knowledge sharing session. The heads of different units of the institution were also present for the talk.
