Ninth Graduation Ceremony

The Ninth Graduation Ceremony of St Aloysius College (Autonomous) was held on Saturday, 1 June 2019 at 3.00 pm in Loyola Hall, St Aloysius PU College Campus, Mangaluru.

It was a time of celebration where students were lauded for the efforts they put in to obtain their degrees. A total of 1982 graduates received their degree certificates, medals and awards; 1101 UG, 756 PG and 125 Diploma graduates. Rev. Dr Stanislaus D'Souza, SJ, President, Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society (MJES) and Provincial, Karnataka Jesuit Province declared the Ninth Graduation Ceremony open. Registrar Dr A.M. Narahari handed over the list of graduates and rank holders to the provincial. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz, SJ, Vice-President, Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society (MJES) and Rector, St Aloys-



ius Institutions led the graduates' pledge.

Rev. Dr Thomas C Mathew, Former Vice Chancellor, Christ (Deemed-to-be-University), Bengaluru was invited as the Chief Guest who delivered the Graduation Day Address.

He advised students that they are graduating into not a brave new world but a disruptive world shaped by 1. The Age of Urbanization; 2. Accelerating Technological Changes; 3. Challenges of an Aging World; 4. Greater Global Connections. He encouraged them to nurture the values of integrity and democracy so that life becomes meaningful. He wished the graduates to Shine to Enkindle. Transform yourself; transforming others is your responsibility and support someone for their education, till your death.

Resource person: Dr. Asha Abraham, Associate professor, PG Dept. of Biotechnology, St. Aloysius College, Mangalore

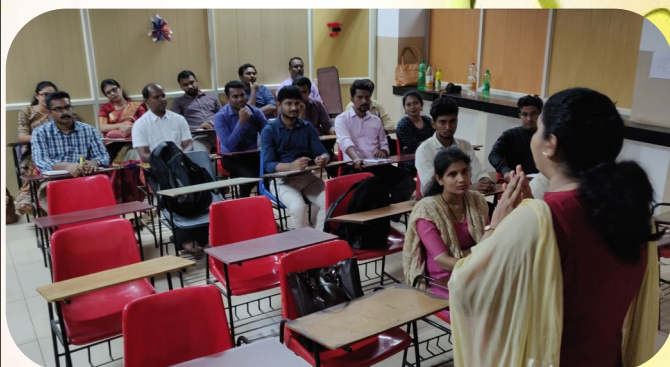

He ended his talk with giving tips on how to look for indexed journal before publishing any research and necessity of usage of anti-plagiarism tools prior to sub-



mission of research articles to any peer review journals.

Recharging of Bore Well through rain water harvesting technique By SAHAAYA group

The Centre for Social Concern, St. Aloysius (Autonomous) College Mangaluru organized a Rural Exposure camp as a part of SAHAYA for the UG students. The camp was mainly focused on providing cross-cultural exposure, their life-style and rural realities like education status, occupation status, health and social status of the village to the students.

The Centre for Social Concern organized projects on Bore well recharging at two different places. The first project was held from 30th May to 6th June 2019 at a remote village named Byanalli, Mundgod and the second project was held from 29th – 30th June 2019 at Maanila-Peruvai,



Bantwal. The first and major operation was to construct a Rain-Water harvesting pit in the village and sensitize villagers about the importance and judicious use of water.

The next project was school intervention. Students along with the staff went to the government schools in the nearby village and were given an opportunity to interact with the students. On the first day students began with the ice-breaking session with some action songs and games. And on the second day they gave talk to the children on importance of education and various topics like importance of education, need for extra-curricular activities and student participation, basic English, shortcut methods for studying, POCSO, life Style Education, health and hygiene, sports, religious harmony and humanity etc.

This camp was a learning experience for students and staff. It was kind of once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to observe and interact with people and showcase their abilities in a rural setup. Most importantly, it provided an excellent platform all to bond with each other and to learn valuable life skills as well. Ms Shwetha Rasquinha Chief co-ordinator, Ms K Gopika and Mr Krishna the co-ordinator of Center for Social Concern along with Mr Kiran Vati K Lecturer, Mr Vineeth Kumar K Assistant Professor and Mr Vincent D'Souza Lab Assistant from Department of Zoology accompanied and guided the students.

Western Ghat Afforestation programme at Arasinamakki

About 38 students of Sahaya team of SAC along with Rector, Fr Dionysius Vaz, SJ in association with 15 environmental activists of National Environment Care Federation (NECF) planted 450 saplings of various fruit-bearing trees to increase the green cover of the reserve forest area in Arasinamakki village in Belthangady ta-

6. The college should finalize specific Policies relating to Research, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Consultancy and other institutional priority areas.
7. The institution has to advertise with regard to its research facilities in order to offer better consultancy services.
8. More academic seminars are to be conducted by involving students
9. The research in Commerce may focus on GST, Insurance, Direct Tax Code and Actuarial Sciences.
10. Awareness to be created with regard to NTA, CSIR.
11. College should prepare for NAAC Accreditation with appropriate response-metric-wise. Triple A (AAA) audit is to be conducted.
12. Courses under AICTE should be encouraged to go for NBA assessment.
13. IQAC meeting s may be conducted without much gap between the meetings.

"As a teen, he suffered from a kidney disease which he considered a blessing, as it left him with plenty of time for prayer. At 18 he signed away his legal claim to his



title and his family's lands and entered the Jesuits. He died shortly thereafter of the plague at the age of 23, having devotedly cared for plague victims in Rome in the outbreak of 1591. He was canonized in 1726 and is the patron saint of youth, AIDS patients and AIDS care givers" added Bishop.

The highlight of the celebration was the ceremonial offertory by students. The students of 62 batches of SAPUC brought non-perishable items during the offertory which would be sent to various Jesuit mission stations.
