

TRIVANDRUM: Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said Congress president Rahul Gandhi's decision to contest from a second seat in the state was symbolic of the grand old party's fight against the Left Front Yahoo reported.

Pinarayi Vijayan said, "Gandhi is one among the 20 candidates and doesn't need to be seen as any one different. We will fight against him. If Wayanad is symbolic of south India, no one in Kerala is going to see this as Gandhi's battle against the BJP. He should have contested from a constituency where a saffron party candidate is in fray. This is nothing but a fight against the Left."

Earlier in the day, Congress chief Rahul Gandhi has picked Wayanad as his second seat, following demands from southern India.Announcing party chief's decision at a press conference, senior leader Randeep Surjewala said that Gandhi chose the Kerala constituency as it is "geographically important."

"Decision of Congress to field Rahul Gandhi from Wayanad shows their priority is to fight the Left in Kerala," Prakash Karat said.

He never raised his voice at the parliament on behalf of the people. He has not brought major projects to the district in I challenge BJP for an open debate on lies of Modi. I am ready to expose his lies in public," Rao continued.

"Without consulting the opposition parties, Modi passed new election funding policy in parliament. It will help the parties to receive funds from anywhere and anytime

We clearly told that it will help to increase corruption. Now BJP received Rs 6000 crore from private organisations. As per new policy, no one can ask from where money has come from," Rao added.
