Public lecture on Economic Slowdown at SAC

CAMPUS: Dr Nagaraj Rayaprolu, professor of Indira Gandhi Institution of Development Research, Mumbai, delivered a public lecture on the topic 'Economic Slowdown' here on Monday. The main focus of the lecture was to give insights on how the country could achieve stable economic growth by the year 2024.

However, the global financial crisis of 2008 caused economic slump. This also led to the decline in growth and ex-

ports, Dr Rayaprolu said.

Dr Rayaprolu said, "The only major avenue to boost growth is stepping up investment demand. Unless India turns investment led growth, it can't attain the goal of five trillion dollar economy by 2024 set by the Prime Minister."

Dr Praveen Martis, the Principal of SAC in his presidential address applauded the department of Economics for selecting a very apt topic and thus helping the students understand a very complex concept.

PM Modi announces \$150 billion line of credit to Pacific island

NEW YORK: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced a \$150 billion line of credit to the group of Pacific island nations for undertaking solar, renewable energy and climate related projects based on their requirement.

Mr Modi, who attended the India-Pacific Islands Developing States (PSIDS) Leaders' Meeting, also announced a total allocation of \$12 million to the member states towards implementation of high-impact developmental project in the area of their choice.

The meeting was held here on Tuesday on the sidelines of the 74th session of the UN General Assembly.

This is the first time he has met the leaders of the PSIDS on the margins of UNGA in a plurilateral format.

The meeting was attended by the Heads of delegation of Fiji, Republic of Kiribati, Republic of Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Republic of Nauru, Republic of Palau, Independent State of Papua New Guinea, The Independent State of Samoa, Solomon Islands, Kingdom of Tonga, Tuvalu and Republic of Vanuatu.

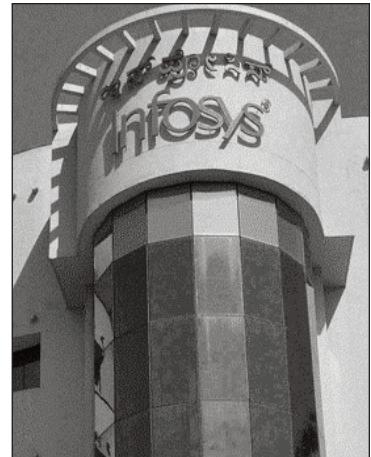
Infosys ranked 3rd in Forbes

NEW DELHI: Infosys, TCS and Tata Motors are among the 17 companies that have made it to the latest Forbes' list of the World's Best Regarded Companies.

While Infosys has been ranked third in the list -- just behind payment technology major Visa and Italian car maker Ferrari, ranked 1 and 2, respectively -- Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has been ranked No. 22. At 31st place, Tata Motors has also found a place among the top 50 companies in the list. Forbes partnered with Statista to prepare the list that includes 250 companies which are ranked based on trustworthiness, social conduct, the strength of their products and services and how they fare as employers.

To gather data, Statista surveyed 15,000 respondents from more than 50 countries, Forbes said.

Infosys marked a huge improvement in the ranking as it jumped to the third position this year, from 31st position in 2018.

"Infosys' leading position headlined an Asian invasion in the rankings," Forbes said.

The other top ten companies in the list for 2019 are Netflix at No. 4, followed by PayPal (5), Microsoft (6), Walt Disney (7), Toyota Motor (8), Mastercard (9), Costco Wholesale (10).

'Swaccha Surathkal Abhiyan' on Sunday

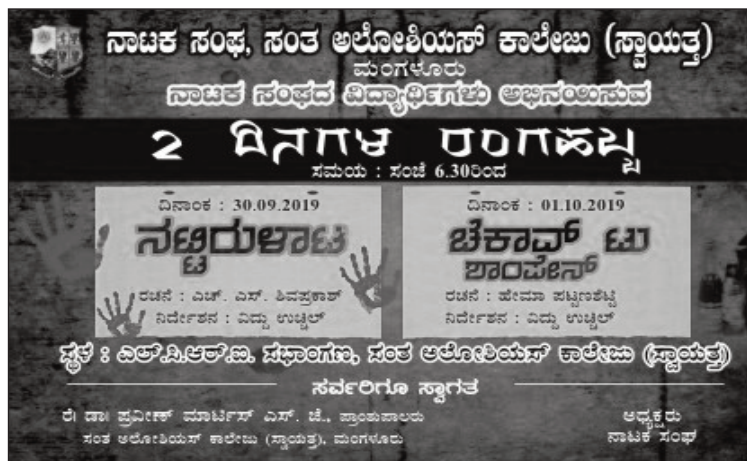
