Stakeholders Feedback Process / Feedback Analysis Report 2016- 21

Curriculum feedback is one of the significant components of curriculum design and review at St Aloysius College (Autonomous). The curriculum is regularly upgraded based on the feedback obtained from the stakeholders. The departmental meetings and the Board of Studies (BOS) meetings at the departmental level are primary forums to promote a deliberation on the revision of syllabus, guided by the apex bodies of the institution such as Registrar's office, Academic Council Governing Body, and the concerned authorities. The curriculum is regularly updated by closely following the policies and guidelines issued by the office of Registrar Evaluation, government policies and UGC guidelines.

The revision of the curriculum/ introduction of any new course/programmme is streamlined through a structured process. Regular departmental meetings dwell on the need to revise the curriculum and its efficacy considering its relevance to students and employers. Proposals for new courses and programmes are put across the BOS meetings. The approved syllabus, new courses and programmes are tabled at the Academic Council meetings for approval. And the suggestions of the Council are incorporated in the succeeding meeting of the BOS to be implemented and is put across the college authorities for affiliation/approval if mandatory.

The feedback process plays a predominant role to ascertain the need for revision or the introduction of a new courses/programmes. Feedback is collected from different stakeholders, such as subject experts, teachers, university nominees, students, alumni and employers/industry/related areas who are part of the Board of Studies. The BOS analyses the relevance of the curriculum in catering the holistic development of the students. The feedback is collected on the factors such as - the curriculum update, reference materials provided, it's applicability to the concerns of local/national/global and regional needs. Feedback is also obtained regarding the appropriateness of curriculum in promoting student's participation in academics and extracurricular activities, the knowledge domain of curriculum, academic progression and its take on employability. The curriculum competence for innovative thinking, critical outlook and for the promotion of student's capability, for life skills are also the significant indicators for collecting feedback.

The feedback is obtained on individual courses/ programmes by the respective departments and the collected feedback is analyzed by each department with an Action Taken Report (ATR). The curriculum is revisited, redesigned from time to time based on the suggestions and recommendations of the stakeholders, in the BOS meeting and new competence-oriented courses are introduced.

The feedback is collected systematically through a structured questionnaire based on a nuanced survey response with the following answer options.

SA -Strongly A- Agree, U-Undecided, DA- Disagree, SD-Strongly Disagree

The feedback sought for all the departments to all the programmes/courses/ syllabi was structured under different factors under seven (07) following questions comprising of the four (04) respondent categories 1. Teachers 2. Alumnus 3. Employer/ Industry/ Allied areas 4. Students, for all the years for the period of 2016-21.
