605kW Rooftop Solar Power Plant installed at SAC Campus

Dt Aloysius Institutions marked a monumental achievement with the inauguration of a 605kW Rooftop Solar Power Plant spread across its four campuses.

The blessing and inauguration of the 605kW Rooftop Solar Power Plant at St Aloysius College (Autonomous),



Mangaluru, was held on 24th September 2021 at L.F. Rasquinha Hall of the College. Mr Sudesh Martis, Additional Chief Electrical Inspector, Department of Electrical Inspectorate, Govt of Karnataka was Chief Guest for the event. Rev. Fr Melwin J Pinto, SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions presided over the programme and Mr Robin Rajesh from Isha Solar Energies was the Guest of Honour. Rev. Dr Praveen Martis, SJ, Principal, Dr Alwyn D'Sa, Registrar of the College, Mr Steevan Pinto, President, SACAA, Dr Vivek K, Technical Head of the project and Mr Rajan Menon were present on the dais.

Dr Tom George, Associate Consultant for the project, briefed about the project with the aid of a virtual presen-



tation.

This is the biggest solar power plant project built for an educational institution in Mangalore by ISHASOL Energies. The entire plant has been built in accordance with standard safety measures, occupational health considerations and environment regulations. ISHASOL Energies is a fully forward-integrated and comprehensive EPC solutions provider. It deploys world-class technology to design, install and commission benchmark solar projects countrywide.

• A total of 1300 highly efficient Mono perc silicon modules were used.

• The 605 kW solar plant is spread across 2600 sq meters of rooftop area and built using PV modules that effectively reduce heat penetration through the metal sheets.

Solar Edge inverter plus power optimizers which boast a maximum efficiency of 99.5 percent have been used for the structure. They are more efficient than normal string inverters as they avoid loss of power caused by



individual panel shading or malfunctioning.

• Besides adding momentum to the green energy revolution in the country, the project is expected to bring immense monetary savings for the institution through a net metering arrangement with MESCOM.

The entire plant has a SCADA enabled Remote Monitoring Facility to monitor all solar panels' operational data. Photovoltaic monitoring systems have been used for the same and provides real-time and recorded data, performance-based alerts, and web-based (or cellular) monitoring.

Operations and Maintenance team at ISHASOL will provide all necessary maintenance services and manage onsite testing of instruments and equipment. The team at ISHASOL is led by Operations Head, Robin Rajesh.

Memorandum of Understanding

Dt Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru has signed a Memorandum of Understanding for cooperation with Poornaprajna Institute of Scientific Research (PPISR), Bengaluru on September 23, 2021. PPISR is a premier research institute, recognized by DSIR, Govt. of India, as an R&D center. Research at PPISR is pursued broadly under three divisions: Biological Sciences, Materials Sciences & Catalysis, Theoretical Sciences. It has



successful industry partnership through innovation, designing and developing novel multifunctional materials that have wide-ranging applications in catalysis, nanotechnology. Etc.

The MoU was signed at the office of the Director of PPISR by the Principal of St Aloysius College Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ and the Director of PPISR Dr. A. B. Halgeri, in the presence of Dr Alwyn D'Sa Registrar, and Dr Ronald Nazareth, Dean, International Collaboration, St Aloysius College Mangaluru.

The MoU would enable cooperation in academic, scientific and research endeavours with specific objectives of organizing student-exchange, faculty exchange, collaborative research for scholars and students at all levels, social outreach programs, exchange of online lectures, exchange of academic information, material and programs , development and implementation of joint research programs, including the development of proposals for funding purposes, joint conferences, workshops and training programs, and other cooperative activities.



Prior to signing of the MoU, a visit to all the laboratories of PPISR was arranged wherein the research team explained the functioning of all high end research equipment. Subsequently, a meeting was convened at the boardroom where the division head of Biological sciences Prof Udupi A. Ramagopal explained about research areas and progress of the biological science unit. He briefed on the facilities concerning Molecular Biology for cloning, recombinant expression, purification of proteins, characterization and crystallization of key biomolecules at ambient temperature and at 4°C available at the unit and also elaborated on the concepts such as microbial isolation, identification of microorganisms, biochemical studies like anti-microbial and anti-oxidant assay systems, plant and microbial secondary metabolites extraction systems etc.

In his presentation Prof Ganapati V. Shanbhag, Head of Material Science and catalysis division gave the overview of the research activities of the unit highlighting diverse backgrounds such as catalysis, industrial chemistry, polymer, nanomaterials etc. and progress of working on various thrust areas like heterogeneous catalysis, shape selective acid-base catalysis, novel micro/mesoporous materials for green chemical processes, biomass conver-



sion to value-added products, catalytic CO₂ utilization by converting into useful chemicals, mesoporous polymers for catalysis and other applications, functional inorganic nanomaterials as applied to photoluminescence, hybrid nanomaterials, photocatalysis, gas sensing, H₂ generation solar cells, 2D materials for opto-electronics, metalorganic-frameworks.

The progress of theoretical sciences was explicated by Prof Sujit Sarkar wherein he highlighted the broad areas of research such as many-body and mesoscopic physics, nanoscience, quantum information theory, quantum communication, quantum cryptography, the foundations of quantum mechanics, astronomy and astrophysics.



The webinar on Wednesday, 29th September, titled "Theatre and Education" endeavoured to inspire and boost self confidence among students. The ession was attended by 174 students.



National Webinar on "Western Ghats: Past, Present and Future"

28 October 2021 (10.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.) Platform: Zoom

The Department of Political Science at St. Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru organised a national webinar titled, "Western Ghats: Past, Present and Future". The talk was delivered by Prof. (Dr) Madhav Dhananjaya Gadgil, Indian ecologist, academic, writer, columnist and the founder of the Centre for Ecological Sciences, former member of the Scientific Advisory



Council to the Prime Minister of India and the Head of the Western Ghats Ecology Expert Panel (WGEEP) of 2010 (Gadgil Commission). He is the recipient of the Pad-

ma Shri (1981) and the Padma Bhushan (2006). Prof Gadgil postured the theme through its historical past that gives lead to the present plight of the Western Ghats. He highlighted the sustainable nature of Indian communities before the advent of the British in India which he exemplified with the works Goan "gaonkaris", Adivasis, etc. However, the British took over village community lands using the device of the Forest Department (FD) in the name of conservation. Hence, most of the influence on India's wildlife policy and Wildlife Act comes from the colonial institutions such as Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS). Milestones of development that took place since India's independence in the form of dams and reservoirs were ironically referred to as 'temples' of modern India. In fact, they devastated not only the wilderness and forests but also a large number of marginalised people without due compensation. Here development has not gone in sync with the interests and wants of the native communities.

Prof Gadgil gave an example of the communities residing in Mangaon who have protected the sacred groves in the Velhe taluka of Pune. These communities have understood the ecosystem services of the grove and have taken



the sole responsibility of protecting it instead of relying on third parties. Through the West Coast Paper Mills of Dandeli, he explained the consequences of state misappropriation and misuse of bamboo resources especially on river Kali. Through the unreported case of the Bharatpur National Park he pointed to the need for community based eco system living. Hence through these examples he proved the fact that the Forest Department and the Wildlife Protection Act have been unable to pro-



tect and their activities have been counterproductive to these ecosystems.

Through the talk, Prof Gadgil highlighted the role of people's participation, the need for ecosystem community living, the destruction that is wrecked on areas of Maharashtra and

Kerala. He cautioned that with the destruction of the ecosystems as found in the Western Ghats, probably many villagers will turn into migrant labourers or construction workers whose lives will be more uncertain.

Rev Fr Leo D'Souza SJ in his comments to the talk appreciated and admired the fact that Prof Gadgil's work emanates from field experience. The latter's focus on the destruction of the Western Ghats beginning with the advent of the British cannot be the sole reason. Rather he

questioned as to "what we are doing" in the present; policies of our governments are no different.

The session was moderated by Dr Smitha Hegde, Plant Biotechnologist, an expert in ferns of the Western Ghats, Professor & Deputy Director at NITTE University, Center for Science Education & Research. She most articulately summarised the talk and conducted the Q&A session.



The Western Ghats is a global biodiversity hotspot whose soil and water sustains the livelihoods of millions of people. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the UN proposes the protection of such regions for ecological balance, which is the need of the hour. The department of Political Science, St Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru attempted to highlight these issues through the webinar.

The webinar began with an invocation by Fr Marcel Rodrigues SJ, HOD Journalism and his team. Dr Rose Veera Dsouza Dean of Faculty of Arts and HOD Political Science welcomed the gathering and introduced the distinguished guests. The webinar concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Joyce Sabina Lobo.

L he PG Dept. of Business Administration (MBA) con-


